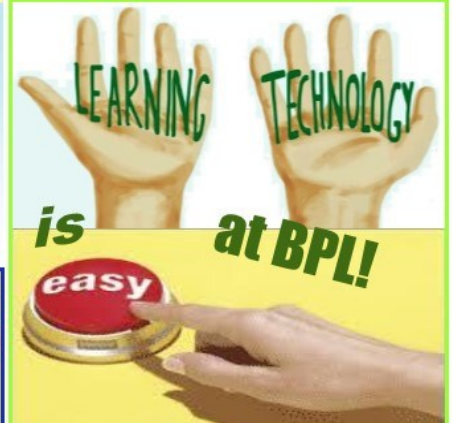

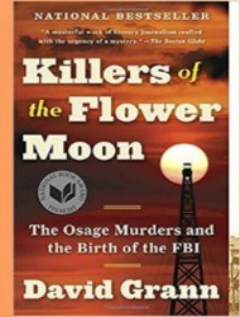

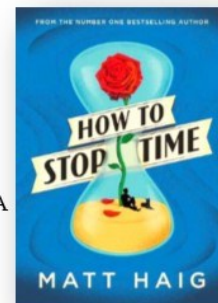

WHITE ROSE CEMETERY - ANNUAL MEMORIAL DAY CEREMONY

The annual White Rose Cemetery Memorial Day Ceremony, held at the cemetery gazebo, will be 9AM, Monday May 28th. Attendance invitations extend to residents, military veterans and families. This annual service will include and honor guard from the American Legion presenting a 21-Gun Salute, play of Taps, and a recitation and demonstration behind the meaning of the American flag folding. The featured speaker will be a representative of the Bartlesville American Legion Post 105. Bestowed by area Blue Star Mothers will be a wreath honoring fallen soldiers. Attendees will recite the Pledge of Allegiance and sing the National Anthem.

Originally called Decoration Day, Memorial Day is a day of remembrance for those who have died while serving our nation. General John Logan, National Commander of the Grand Army of the Republic, gave his official proclamation in 1868; thus, establishing an official Decoration Day; bringing together the Nation to honor American patriots.

The Memorial Day ceremony, held at the City of Bartlesville-owned White Rose Cemetery, has been an annual tradition for more than a century. According to Kim Inman, Cemetery Relations Coordinator, "In 1899 a cemetery was laid out south of the area that was Bartlesville, Indian Territory. The following year citizens of the City of Bartlesville began holding Memorial Day services to honor veterans buried at White Rose Cemetery, and this tradition has continued since 1900. We will pause to appreciate the blessings of freedom, recognize the power and virtue of sacrifice, and remember those who gave their lives to strengthen and preserve the invaluable gift of freedom," said Inman.
