Explore Newspaper Archive

Did you know that you can research the world's largest online newspaper archive from our website? Newspaper Archive is available for free for our patrons and can be accessed through your home computer 24/7. Newspapers are a wonderful resource that you can use to help you trace your family tree and help you to further uncover your ancestors' place within their community.

You can look at newspapers from six states: Oklahoma, Kansas, Missouri, Arkansas, Texas, and Illinois. The date range for the newspapers starts as early as 1813 and as current as this year. Though this is not a comprehensive collection, it is extensive.

To search, you have three easy options. First, you can search all six states at once by typing in your ancestor's first and last name and even a keyword for a historical event, e.g. moon landing. Second, you can search by date by choosing a specific year and a publication for a location. Third, you can search by location by selecting a state and then a newspaper for a town.

Newspaper Archive lets you save your searches. You can register for free on the database to create your own online folder where you can easily store and organize your newspaper clippings, and open this folder anytime you log into our Newspaper Archive database. The database also offers free memorized search tools that will automatically search any newspapers added to the digital collection. New content is added weekly.



The Bartlesville Public Library is pleased to announce a new collection. The "Library of Things" opened on Monday, June 11th and is now available for patron checkout. The Things Collection has a wide variety of items that patrons can use for a short period of time. Are you going on a summer vacation trip? The Library now has portable DVD Players you can use in the car. Do you need a camera to take pictures of a special occasion? The Library now has a Photography Kit you can borrow that includes a Kodak Zoom Digital Camera, tabletop tripod, and "how to" books for the beginning photographer. The Things Collection also lets you try out something before you buy it. Are you interested in learning how to play the guitar? The Library now has an electric, a bass, and an acoustic guitar as part of the collection. Take your pick! There is even a Kids' Acoustic Guitar Starter Kit.

Some of the other items in the Library of Things Collection include sewing machines, laminators, microscopes, telescopes, a car engine reader, a Blu-ray DVD player, a multitude of cake pans in all sizes and shapes, and musical instruments. There are also many items for kids and teens. Library Director Shellie McGill said, "The goal for the Things Collection is simple. We are trying to make available things that people might be intrigued by, interest in, or want to try. The Bartlesville Public Library is one of the first in this area to have a Things Collection. The collection will continue to grow. Each year, additional items will be added. If you have a suggestion for a Thing to add, please let us know."

Any item in the Library of Things Collection can be checked out for 1 week. The item can be renewed IF no one else has it on hold. If what you want is checked out—you can put it on hold and you will be notified when it is ready. There is a \$1.00 per day fine for items returned late. A complete catalog of all items included in the Things Collection is at the Reference Desk. All items are checked out and returned to the Reference Desk.
