Creative Corner

The Bartlesville Public Library's new Creative Corner is now accepting reservations for September 16th and later. The Creative Corner is a creative space complete with supplies for teachers, crafting enthusiasts, and library patrons to work on bulletin boards/classroom visual materials, flyers, scrapbooks, artistic signs and countless other creative projects. The Corner comes equipped with a computer, printer, a Cricut Maker, numerous Cricut cartridges, a Cricut Press, a light table, embosser, paper cutter, specialized tools and many creative supplies.

This new service is made possible by a grant received from ConocoPhillips. Library Director Shellie McGill said, "We are extremely grateful to have the funds to create this new service and make it available to our

community. We are determined to provide an excellent collection of free services, programs and classes that engage our community. We also appreciate the many donations of craft supplies we received from area residents. With their help, we have fully stocked cabinets and we are ready to be your creative destination!"

The Creative Corner is available for use during regular library hours. Individuals can reserve the area for two hours, and for groups of three or more, the Corner can be reserved for up to four hours. Crafting @ Your Library

With the opening of the new Creative Corner, the Library is hosting monthly crafting classes. The classes, which will feature a wide array of crafts to explore, are free and open to the public. In addition to the monthly crafting classes, the Library offers a newly-formed Scrapbooking Club, which will also meet monthly. Beginners and those who have been scrapbooking for years are all welcome to attend to share and learn new things from each other. The Scrapbooking Club will also be supplemented with new projects and techniques you can choose to try!

On **Thursday, September 12** from **6 pm to 8 pm**, there will be a <u>Sewing Tote Bags Class</u>. You will learn how to sew a simple and useful tote bag to carry your belongings. Some sewing machines will be provided, including those from the Library's Things Collection, but if you have one please bring it. You will receive a kit of supplies and should be able to complete a tote bag to take home with you at the end of the class.

On **Thursday, September 19**, from **2 pm to 4 pm**, the <u>Scrapbooking Club</u> will meet and learn about the Library's new Cricut machine. There will be basic supplies available for scrapbooking, but you are welcome to bring your own.

On Thursday, October 10, from 2 pm to 4 pm, there will be a <u>Creating Journals Class</u>. You will be provided with a paper journal and will be provided with a kit of materials to construct a simple cloth cover for your journal. Sewing machines will be provided, including those from the Library's Things Collection.

On **Thursday**, **October 31**, from **6 pm to 8 pm**, the <u>Scrapbooking Club</u> will meet and share ideas, tips and techniques. Basic scrapbooking materials will be provided, and you are welcome to bring your own project and supplies.

The classes will be held in the Library's meeting room C. Class size is limited, so registration is required. To register or for more information, please call the Local and Family History desk at 918-338-4167 for more information.

Preschool

Picture books and early leveled readers

Read-along sets, containing book and cd

TLC Kits, themed resource kits, which are currently being updated

Playaway Launchpads, pre-loaded learning tablets which can be checked out of the "Things Collection"

Elementary and Middle School

Free use of computers and IPads in the library

Digital Conversion Center

The Bartlesville Public Library is honored to have received a sponsorship for \$350 from the Bartlesville Rotary Club to assist in the creation of a Digital Conversion Center. This equipment allows the user to convert older personal media to new technology. For example, those VHS tapes or camcorder tapes you have can be converted to DVD or digital.

The Digital Conversion Center is located in the Local Family History Area of the Library, directly behind the circulation desk. This center is a self-service center and can be reserved in 2-hour blocks. We will provide basic instruction and the patron performs the conversions. The equipment does conversions in real time so if you are converting a 2 hour tape from one media to another, it will take 2 hours to perform the conversion. Please bring a thumb drive or a DVD to load your converted files onto.

We have a DVD Recorder that converts VHS to DVD, a converter that converts Video to Digital, Vinyl to Digital, Cassette's to Digital, and a VHS-C Converter to DVD or Digital.

The user is required to sign a release indemnifying the library should the media become damaged in the conversion process and agreeing to follow copyright laws.

The center is available for library patron use at no charge during library hours. Please call 918-338-4167 to make a reservation for the center.

Mausoleum Stories at White Rose Cemetery

White Rose Cemetery will present "Mausoleum Stories" on Oct. 25 and 26, 6:00 PM at the White Rose Mausoleum. This event features historical reenactors portraying early day Bartlesville pioneers at rest at White Rose. This popular event is a fun and interesting evening of theater at the beautiful White Rose Cemetery Mausoleum. The historic cemetery has approximately 10,000 interments and is the resting place of some of Bartlesville's most celebrated citizens. Mausoleum Stories features five or six of these notables and each year brings new stories.

According to Kim Inman, Cemetery Relations Coordinator, "The goal remains the same each year: provide visitors with a program that is different, interesting and informative. This is an opportunity for us to share the rich history of White Rose and its pioneers with the community."

As in the past, Marilyn Johnson will take the research provided by Inman and write the script. Kristin Duncan will take over the rolls of casting and directing. The "Guardian of the Stories" will introduce each of the pioneers as they tell about their lives. Those portrayed this year are Veshelo "Shela" Bitinis Ward, Jesse Lee Overlees, Dan Mitani, George Orloski and Nelson Carr.
