September is Library Card Sign-up Month!

Bartlesville Public Library has joined libraries across the nation to promote card holder awareness during September's Library Card Sign-up Month initiative. This event, held in association with the American Library Association, is aimed to encourage everyone to renew or sign up for a library card-including BPL's new digital card.

Library Director Shellie McGill says "the value of having a library card is "priceless" yet sign-up is free to those living, working, or attending school within the Library's service area." "A library card is a tool that can be used to acquire knowledge and enrich our lives like nothing else can," said McGill. "BPL has more than 120,000 materials-including books, DVDs, Blu-rays, audio books, video games, and our latest collection: The Library of Things—available for checkout to anyone who has a card. The list of resources and services available to library card holders is virtually endless." McGill said Library Card Sign-up Month is an opportunity to let everyone know the value of having a library card but also serves as a reminder to parents, teachers, and students that a card is "the most important school supply of all."

According to the American Library Association, studies show that children who read at home and use library resources perform better in school. Likewise, they are more apt to continue using the library as a source of lifetime learning, and later in life they are also more likely to introduce their own children to the library at a young age.

This year BPL will be celebrating library users with special, weekly giveaways. Beginning September 4th, anyone who visits the Library and checks out materials, signs up for a new card or renews their old library card can fill out a entry ticket for the weekly drawing. At the end of each week throughout September, BPL Staff will draw a draw a prize winning entry. Prizes will be awarded each Friday. Adults will receive \$25.00 in "Chamber Bucks" issued by the Bartlesville Regional Chamber of Commerce. Children will receive \$10.00 in Chamber Bucks. Also—during September, any current library card holder can trade their old card in for one of BPL's newly designed library cards for free!

To sign up for a new library card, simply provide proof of address with a photo ID, such as a non-expired driver's license or State-issued ID, and a piece of mail matching that address. Mail must be postmarked within the last 30 days and addressed to the card holder. Children's cards will be issued to adult cardholders with no document requirements.




THE STORY OF WORLD WAR 1

MAUSOLEUM STORIES TO BE TOLD AT WHITE ROSE

White Rose Cemetery will present "Mausoleum Stories" on October 18 and 19 at 7:00 PM and on Saturday, October 20, at 2:00 PM at the White Rose Mausoleum. This event features historical re-enactors portraying early day Bartlesville pioneers at rest at White Rose.

The event, formerly known as Bartlesville Notables began in 2006 as an OK Mozart Showcase event and has grown, and changed each year since that time. According to Marilyn Johnson, Mausoleum Stories scriptwriter, "We have been adamant that the play be very respectful of those interred here. We focus on the presentation of historical information."

The popular event is a fun and interesting evening of theater at the beautiful Mausoleum. The historical resting place of some of Bartlesville's most celebrated citizens. The event features only a few of the notables buried at White Rose Cemetery and each year brings new stories. The event guides visitors to the chapel area, where costumed actors will share the stories of those being portrayed.

As in the past, the "Guardian of the Stories" will introduce each of the pioneers as they tell about their lives. Those being portrayed this year are a Confederate and a Union Soldier, a victim of the first shootout on Statehood day, a local Suffragette, and a Cherokee Freedmen.
