

Newspapers

The largest online newspaper archive

Starting this month, the Bartlesville Public Library has a new historical newspaper database for patrons to use. *Newspapers.com* will replace the old newspaper database. Patrons can search for marriage announcements, social pages, birth announcements, obituaries, sports, and news in any newspaper available in the database. The database ties in with the <u>Ancestry</u> website in its searches. Patrons will need to use the Library's edition of <u>Ancestry</u>, which is only available at the Library.

This database also includes newspapers outside of the United States. There are several ways to search for information in the newspapers: general, location and paper. The general search uses keyword, date and location parameters. Therefore, a patron can search for their ancestors in all the available newspapers. Users can search for newspapers located in a particular town. For instance, searching for newspapers in Bartlesville brings up 19 newspapers that have existed over the years. A search for specific newspaper titles can be located in *Newspapers.com*. Using this search function for the *Bartlesville Examiner*, the database shows six newspapers with Examiner in their titles over the years in Bartlesville, which includes the *Morning Examiner* and the *Weekly Examiner*.

Hayden Murphey, Head of Reference Services Librarian suggests patrons try searching for ancestors in the *Newspapers.com* database. It is a great research tool and will help with historical and genealogy searches. For more information, call 918-338-4167.

The Memorial Day ceremony has been held at the City of artlesville owned White Rose Cemetery

Bartlesville owned White Rose Cemetery for over a century. According to Kim Inman, Cemetery Relations Coordinator, "In 1899 a cemetery was laid out south of the area that was Bartlesville, Indian Territory. The very next year citizens of the City of Bartlesville began holding Memorial Day services to honor veterans buried at White Rose and have continued that tradition since 1900."

After the invocation, a guest speaker from American Legion Post 105 will remember those who gave their lives to

strengthen and preserve the invaluable gift of freedom. Boy Scout troop 6 will present the colors and lead the Pledge of Allegiance and the local Blue Star Mothers will present a wreath in honor of those who have made the ultimate sacrifice. As in past years, American flags will be placed on each veteran's grave by local scout troops.

The event is free and the community is invited to attend.

Library Receives American Rescue Plan Act Grant

The Oklahoma Department of Libraries has awarded the Bartlesville Public Library and the Literacy Services Department grant monies funded by the American Rescue Plan Act. The grant totaled \$15,377.86. Grants funds can be used in a variety of ways including the purchase of connectivity devices, remote access to online resources, support video conference capabilities, and health and wellness materials for library collections.

Thanks to the funding from the ARPA grant the Library was able to replace/update equipment, purchase materials and expand services. Two laptops were purchased for test proctoring and patron use. Additionally, eight iPads were purchased; four for children and four for teens. The grant funded a wireless laser projector for use in Literacy's instructional and Zoom classes. Literacy now has additional materials for the ELL (English Language Learners) and Citizenship classes.

This grant was funded by the Institute of Museum and Library Services. They work to advance, support,

and empower America's museums, libraries, and related organizations through grant-making, research, and policy development.
