IT'S YOUR HEALTH

The Literacy Services Department is announcing a new line-up of programs, classes, and events to strengthen the health and wellness for area children, teens, adults, and seniors. Literacy Coordinator Karen Kerr-McGraw stated that "in the 2020 health rankings by the United Health Foundation, they listed Oklahoma in 46th place for overall health status when compare to other states. Oklahomans have high rates of heart disease, diabetes and obesity as well as unhealthy behaviors such as low consumption of fruits and vegetables and low physical activity." Thanks to a grant from the Oklahoma Department of Libraries, classes and programs designed to improve health and wellness will be offered weekly.

Beginning in September, the exercise classes will begin again at Unity Square. Two new classes, Dance N' Define and Body Weight Blast have been added to the schedule. Other classes include Yoga, Tai Chi, Rev + Flow, Pound, Zumba, Xtreme Hip Hop and Gentle Yoga.

Also, the all-time favorite cooking class, *In the Kitchen with Susan* begins monthly presentations on Tuesday, September 7th at 12 Noon. A new class, *Cooking Smart with Barb* will make its debut on Thursday, September 16 at 12 Noon. In addition, Ms. Kerr-McGraw said special program events will be held throughout the year, each targeting health and/or wellness. The first to get underway is a 4-part weekly information series regarding insurance presented by Lori Roll with Phoenix Insurance. The series begins Tuesday, September 7 at 10:00 AM and will cover a variety of topics related to all types of insurance.

WEBCAM & HEADPHONES NOW AVAILABLE

Thanks to a grant from the Oklahoma Department of Libraries, the Library now has Webcam and Headset Kits for patrons to use both in-house or at home. The webcam and headset can be used in a variety of ways! Patrons can utilize this kit for business meetings or content streaming to personal channels such as YouTube.

The Logitech webcam connects to a user's computer through a USB port and works for programs such as Zoom, Skype, and Twitch. The attached plastic cover provides visual privacy while not disrupting the

quality of the streaming feed. The MPOW headset is both headphones and microphone; also connecting to the user's computer through USB. A unique feature to the headset is a handheld remote that allows for easier usage of basic volume and talk controls. A two-way USB adapter

is also included in the kit. All these items come in a small plastic case that can be easily carried in a backpack, briefcase, or purse. No software is required for installation, but internet and computer access with a webcam compatible program is a must.

The Library has kits to checkout for both in-house and at home usage. The in-house kits are available upon request at the Information Desk. The take-home kit is maintained in the Library of Things Collection and requires a library card to checkout. Inquiries should be directed to the Information Desk or call 918-338-4169.

The Playaway has a universal audio jack that is compatible with headphones, ear buds, and auxiliary cords. This means you can hook it to your vehicles audio system, headphones, earbuds, or a portable speaker. This makes it easier for multiple people to be able to listen at the same time. PERSONALIZE YOUR GIFTS

Make your gifts extra special this year by personalizing them at the Library's Creative Corner. The Library has a specialized crafts area with all the supplies and equipment you would need to create the perfect gift. Whether the occasion is a birthday, anniversary, or Christmas, it's a great time to get started on those personal gifts that mean so much. If you are a long-time crafter or diving into crafting for the first time, the BPL has just what you need

In the Creative Corner, crafters will find a Cricut Maker and a Cricut Expression along with the accessories needed to create one of a kind projects. Basic tools (scraper, weeder, spatula, etc), blades, cutting mats and pens are included. Choose from a large collection of cartridges to use with the Expression as well as cardstock and specialty scrapbooking paper. There is also a heat press available for transferring heat transfer vinyl (often called "HTV"), and a Cricut Bright Pad to illuminate fine lines for tracing, cut lines for weeding, and more.

The Maker is perfect for use with a wide range of materials including paper, cardstock, vinyl, cardboard, fabric, thin wood and leather. Many crafters love to use Cricut machines for greeting cards, scrapbooking, paper crafts or customizing T-shirts with iron-on designs. Making custom mugs and tumblers is another popular use for vinyl decals created with Cricut. Party decor, wall art, customized signs, stickers. The list goes on and on and the possibilities are endless! Let your imagination take you away!

One of the best places to find Cricut projects and cut files is on <u>Cricut Design Space</u>. This is where all Cricut projects begin, whether you are creating something from scratch or using a pre-designed project. The Library provides that subscription for you. Design Space contains a huge database of images and fonts to help you create whatever you can think up!

There really is something for everyone when it comes to the Cricut machine, however, getting started can be a little intimidating. Just let the staff know that you are using the equipment for the first time and they will explain the basics to you. There are also many great tutorials online. With a couple of practice projects, you can learn enough basics to get you on your way toward creating whatever you dream up. You can reserve a three-hour time slot to use the Creative Corner by calling the Information desk at 918-338-4168. The possibilities are endless in the Creative Corner. Happy Crafting!
